

Ebola Assessment Tool for School-aged Children

Is the child exhibiting Ebola-related symptoms?

- » Fever of 100.4°F or 38°C
- » Severe headache
- » Weakness
- » Diarrhea
- » Vomiting
- » Abdominal pain
- » Unexplained bleeding or bruising

If YES to the above questions:

- Ask the child to follow you from the classroom. Do not touch the child.
- Seat the child alone in a room where you can watch them (either through a window or slightly open door) The child should always be monitored, do not leave them alone.
- Contact the parents and ask them to take their child to a health-care provider. Make sure the healthcare provider is contacted before the child is taken there.
- Contact the Snohomish Health District Communicable Disease Program at (425) 339-5278 to facilitate evaluation of the child. Provide the Health District with contact information for the parents.
- If the child vomits or has diarrhea, close off the contaminated room and call the Health District for information on cleaning and disinfection. Cleaning must be done with full proper protective equipment and proper disinfection (quaternary ammonia or fresh 1:10 bleach solution).

If NO to the above questions:

- The child does not have Ebola.
- Follow your standard procedures for a sick child.
